- Cups will be awarded to the exhibitor who receives 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> place in a class in each division. Points are awarded as 3 points (1<sup>st</sup> place), 2 points (2<sup>nd</sup> place), 1 point (3<sup>rd</sup> place). The points are totalled and the person with the highest number of points is awarded the cup for that division. So the more classes you enter, the better chance you have of winning a cup!
- Cups are awarded for a period of 12 months until the next show; please make sure that you return your cup before or on the day of the show.
